Hanging Baskets. Last orders for baskets from Tony Dawson (302286)-, & our thanks to Tony who has raised £236 this summer for the Building Fund

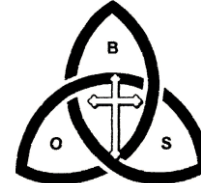

Post Communion Prayer

Reflection:

John the Baptist is revered as a martyr and a saint by the church, though Herod had technically imprisoned him as a political prisoner. This is recorded by the Jewish historian Josephus who gives an account of the clash between these two men. John was beheaded because he spoke the truth, and criticised a weak tyrant whose political conduct and personal & moral ethics he dared to criticise. History has continued to record people who have challenged evil rulers who misuse power and position – Thomas a Becket, Oscar Romero, Janin Luwum. Herod's guilty conscience is revealed when he is fearful that Jesus is really John raised from the dead.
